
LIVING APOSTLES TODAY

Living Apostles Today



Before Marley went to sleep, her grandpa told her a story from the children's Bible. The story he chose was about the Lord Jesus. After he finished reading, Marley's grandpa prayed with her and wished her good night. As he was about to leave the room, Marley asked, "You know grandpa, it is a great pity that the Lord Jesus is no longer alive. He did so many wonderful things and was so kind to everyone."

Her grandpa replied, "Yes, Marley, you are quite right. You see, when Jesus returned to His Father in heaven, many people were very sad, especially His friends, the disciples. They felt exactly the same way you do. The Lord Jesus told them that He was going home to His Father and He would send them the Holy Spirit so that they could continue His work and represent Him on earth.

Jesus also told them they should go to all the people to teach and to baptise with water.

Suggestions for the Teacher

Lead-In

Show the picture to the children. Discuss with them what they see. Ask what she/he may feel.... Show them pictures with our Apostles and the Chief Apostle in the Community magazine.

Lesson Instructions Begin telling the story...

Discuss with the children...

- Can you name some men Jesus called to be His Apostles? (Peter, John, ...).
- What did Jesus say to the Apostles before He ascended to be with His Father? (Go to all the people to teach and to baptise them.)
- Do they still live today? (No, Jesus has given us Apostles today. They work in His name.)
- What is the main task of the Apostles today?
 (They help us preparing ourselves for the return of Jesus.)
- How do they do it?
 (They preach, baptize, seal, forgive sins, dispense Holy Communion, ordain ministers,...)

Have the children repeat...

- Apostles today are sent to proclaim God's word and dispense the sacraments.
- They are sent by Jesus to teach the Gospel and prepare us for His return.

Real-Life Application (explain the following)

- Each child of God has an Apostle. He works by the commission of Jesus.
- Do you know your Apostle? What is his name? Where does he live?
- If possible, we show the children a photograph of their Apostle.
- How can we help the Apostles today?
 (We behave more like Jesus. We become proof of the Apostles' teaching and authority.)

Repeat the Message
